I love this program. It's a good environment for me. The classes are smaller and everyone was so respectful right off the bat.

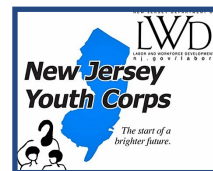
The staff actually care about you and your well-being. If you have something going on, they talk to you about it. You get a lot of personal attention here. They are strict, but in a good way.
